As we wrap up another successful term at Hillbourne Primary School, we celebrate our pupils' achievements and the unwavering support from families and staff.

A major highlight was our 'Outstanding' Ofsted inspection in February, reflecting the dedication of our school community. We are also proud of our Key Stage 2 results, which met or exceeded national standards. Well done Year 6!

Our "Your Time" initiative saw 100% pupil participation in extra-curricular clubs, including STEM, gardening, and mindfulness, ensuring inclusive opportunities for all, including PP and SEN pupils.

In September, we'll launch the VIP initiative, where pupils who consistently demonstrate our core values, Being Ready, Respectful, and Safe, will be recognised with a red hoody.

Every pupil also visited Broadstone Library, encouraging a love of reading by borrowing books for the summer. We were honoured to host the Mayor of Poole and our local MP and look forward to the School Council's visit to Parliament next term.

#### **Corfe Castle visit**

Year 3 had a fantastic day exploring the historic ruins of Corfe Castle! The children spent the day walking around the site, discovering shot holes in the stone walls, and imagining what life was like in the past. They learned about William the Conqueror, discussed who lived in the castle, and what daily life might have looked like. A highlight was seeing the steam train pass by, adding to the atmosphere of the day. Most importantly, we explored the story of the Parliamentarians and Royalists, and how their conflict shaped the castle's dramatic appearance today. It was a fun and educational experience for all!





## Year 3 Visit to The Etches Collection

Year 3 had a brilliant time visiting The Etches Collection Museum. The children were given a guided tour of the museum, where they saw an incredible range of fossils and learned all about them from Nick, our expert guide. He taught us about how fossils are formed and the different types of soils they're found in. The highlight for many was getting to hold real fossils in our hands—it was a truly hands-on learning experience that brought our science topic to life!

#### **Year 5 Trip to the Ancient Technology Centre**

Fig Class had an unforgettable and educational day at the Ancient Technology Centre, diving into the world of Anglo-Saxon life. The children trained as warriors, tried their hand at weaving and construction, and watched a fascinating fire demonstration over lunch. 
